I. DISCUSSION OF INCIDENT

This report contained a photograph of two very unusual objects. The source, an AF Captain, stated that he was attempting to photograph "a circle" that he observed near a rainbow. The "circle" disappeared but he took a picture anyway. Upon developing, or having the negatives developed, two circular objects, similar in appearance to the planet, Saturn, were noticed.

II. STATUS OF INVESTIGATION

Examination of the negative under a microscope showed that the images on the print were caused by two damaged spots on the negative. The cause of those damaged spots is unknown but it appeared that the emulsion had been heated or burned as it was brownish in color. The spots could also have been due to something touching the emulsion while it was still in a gelatin state.

III. CONCLUSIONS

The images on the print were due to damaged spots on the negative.
