Colman S. VonKEVICZKY, MMSE, (Major Ret., Founder and Director of the Intercontinental UFO Galactic Spacecraft - Research and Analytic Network, IUFON) deposes and says

"On August 29, 1978, at 11:00 a.m. in the lobby of the U.S. Department of State (2201 C Street, Washington DC, NW 20520) through the inter-office phone (X 28018) I was connected with Dr. Michael A.G. MICHAUD, Dep. Dir. of the Office of International Security. After mutual introductions, I informed him as to the nature of my visit:

I came from New York City to have your confirmation on your declaration and warning, - published in the National Enquirer, July 25, 1978 issue under the headline: Top State Dept. Officials Say:

"ALIENS FROM OTHER SOLAR SYSTEMS ARE A POTENTIAL THREAT TO US, AND WE ARE A POTENTIAL THREAT TO THEM." - "THIS INCLUDES THE POSSIBILITY OF MILITARY ACTION." - Are you in agreement with this printed statement?

- Yes I do. It is what I stated. Please give me your address and I will mail you a full copy of my speech, - answered Mr. Mishaud.
His speech never arrived to my office."

Aliens from other worlds pose a possible threat to mankind — and we may be courting global disaster unless we prepare now for eventual contact with outer space beings, warn top U.S. State Dept. officials.

Michael A.G. Michaud, deputy director of the State Department's office of international security policy, said we should begin considering how to respond to potentially hostile extraterrestrials when we do make contact with them.

"Aliens from other solar systems are a potential threat to us, and we are a

potential threat to them," Michaud declared.

"Even if an alien species had achieved true peace within its own ranks, it would still be worried about us and would take the measures it felt were necessary to protect itself," Michaud theorized.

"This includes the possibility of military action."

Irwin Pikus, deputy director of the State Department's office of space affairs, agreed we ought to be ready to deal with a potential alien threat.

"Contact with other-world beings is something that would have tremendous

repercussions if it happened and we weren't prepared," Pikus added.

Michaud, 39, a 15-year State Dept. veteran, believes an international panel of experts from many fields should be set up to consider how mankind should respond to contact with outer space creatures.

"There's very little serious attention given to this subject by people outside of science," he added.
