

U.N. SECRETARY GENERAL U THANT DUTIFUL ACTION—ACCORDING TO THE CHARTER OF THE UNITED NATIONS—ON THE U.F.O. FORCES CREATED INTERNATIONAL SECURITY PROBLEM.

A summing up of the United States Government's intervention and counter measures

February 1, 1966: UFO MEMORANDUM, addressed to Secretary General U THANT by Colman S. VonKEVICZKY, military scientist, - member of the U.N. Secretariat, Office of Public Information.

February 10, '66: Upon presented military analysis and documentation U Thant ASSIGNED VonKeviczky, to elaborate the first UN-UFO PROJECT. (Liaison: Ms. Josephine BLACKLOCK, Special Project Secretary of U Thant.)

February 14, '66: Head of the World Health Organization, Ms. Sylvia MEAGHER, WARNED VonKeviczky that U.S. Ambassador demanded his immediate removal from the Secretariat staff, and referred United States' thorough scientific UFO study for the United Nations.

February 15, '66: OPI Photo and Exhibit Dept. Chief Joseph GRINDE surprisingly was ordered to LAY OFF immediately to Mr. VonKeviczky.

February 24, '66: As requested by Thant, the UN-UFO PROJECT WAS PRESENTED to his Chef of Cabinet, C.V. NARASIMHAN. 45 minutes conference was held on the details of the projected UN UFO Department.

February March, 1966:

Pentagon prompt disposal to find a suitable University for scientific study of Unidentified Flying Objects. (Condon Report, page XVII, PREFACE)

The request of AFOSR was pursuant to the recommendation made in March, 1966, of an *ad hoc* panel of the United States Air Force Scientific Advisory Board, chaired by Dr. Brian O'Brien. Subsequently, as chairman of the Advisory Committee to the Air Force Systems Command of the National Academy Sciences-National Research Council, Dr. O'Brien had advised AFOSR on the suitability of the University of Colorado as the grantee institution.

June 18, '66: USAF UFO Consultant Prof. J. Allen HYNEK, PhD, member of the CIA-OSI (Office of Scientific Intelligence) visited Thant to satisfy him on the U.S. Air Force UFO project.

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*** PREFACE**

On 31 August 1966, Colonel Ivan C. Atkinson, Deputy Executive Director of the Air Force Office of Scientific Research, addressed a letter to the University of Colorado. In it he outlined the belief of AFOSR that a scientific investigation of unidentified flying objects conducted wholly outside the jurisdiction of the Air Force would be of unusual significance from the standpoint of both scientific interest in and public concern with the subject.

The \$ 1/2 million assignment by the "conducted wholly outside the jurisdiction of the Air Force", OFFICIALLY PRECLUDED THE UNIVERSITY from any study of those "TOP SECRET" UFO files, which were investigated by the authorized military scientists. Thus the assignment restricted the Condon Committee to study only those private UFO organizations, clubs, hobbyists, ghost-hunters, etc., which week-end UFO amusement never had anything to do with sciences or even with the UFO problem.
