Dear Mr. MacDougall:

Your letter of November 20, 1967 concerning my book, Science the Public and the UFO was much appreciated and a copy was forwarded to you on December 14th.

I wonder if you would now be kind enough to advise as to what action is intended regarding a review of this book. For information, the publishing of the book has been a non-profit venture as it was written for the purpose of informing the public about certain facts about the UFO problem of which they are not generally aware. Also, many authors who have written books on UFOs have been accused of writing simply for the purpose of financial gain without attention to their facts. As I am very serious about what I have written, I did not wish to be accused of such a motive and am therefore selling the book at cost price to myself. This in itself should be sufficient proof of my seriousness.

My task now is to sell the book, of course, in order to inform people of what I have to say about this matter of considerable public interest. I have taken certain steps in the way of advertising the book, but any further action depends at the moment on what I may expect from the Canadian Press.

For this reason, I need to know whether CP will write a review, and if so, is there an indication as to the circulation it might receive, and how soon I might expect such a review to be published.. If you could possibly enlighten me in this regard, it will be very helpful to me in planning further advertising and distribution of review copies.
