

Looking at the structure itself, it was noted that the two pipes and the laminated nature of the wreck point to a conclusion that it was some sort of container. The fact that both pipes have about a two-inch bore indicates that there was probably a fluid flow and return system. The fact that one pipe is thick walled while the other is modest indicates that there was probably a very high pressure system involved. Since the object was originally intact and broke apart during its last moments, it would indicate that the pipes probably connected the two parts. Therefore, we may justifiably conclude that the high pressure was generated in one of the parts, transmitted to the other and made use of there, returning through the thin walled pipe.

Now, when fabrication of this type is used, it is for the purpose of transmitting energy from one place to another. Probably this is what happened with the original device. Here we can visualize some means held inside one container generating an extremely high pressure within a relatively incompressible fluid. The fluid was then transmitted to the other container where it could turn a turbine or similar device to generate, perhaps, electricity to be used by the beings who built it.

If we reason what we would be likely to do under similar circumstances, and look about us for similar devices, it is logical to conclude that this device was just a semi-portable electric generator, obtaining its prime energy
