

It happens that a great many sightings cannot in any way be accounted for by the limited explanations given by these two worthy gentlemen. Therefore, they have only explained some sightings. It is the unexplained ones that people want to know about.

The main reason I wrote my book was to bring many facts to the attention of the public which are not generally known, but which the public has a right to know, despite what the scientific establishment tells us (or tries to suppress). I believe it is the task of the CBC to present the whole story, and not distorted segmented bits which mislead and confuse.

I am not trying to sell you a copy of my book (as I have already donated one to you) but I hope that someone in the CBC will make use of it in an effort to give the public much more information of this world-wide mystery than has been presented in the past.
