This is in response to your Freedom of Information Act request of February 16, 1979, on behalf of the Citizens Against UFO Secrecy (CAUS), and subsequent telephone conversations with a member of my staff. In your letter you request all documents which this Agency may have that relate or pertain to Unidentified Flying Objects. You also request any and all documents relating to an NSA "group meeting on Thurs., 5 Feb."

Pursuant to your telephone request, I am enclosing a copy of the testimony of our former General Counsel, Daniel B. Silver, that was delivered before the Subcommittee on Legislation of the House Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence on April 5, 1979. However, I am unable to provide you with a copy of the testimony delivered by Central Intelligence Agency (CIA) Deputy Director, Frank G. Carlucci. You should be able to obtain a copy of this testimony by writing to the CIA.
