Dear Brian:

I agree with the dispensing of the formality - please call me Art.

You will recall my article "A Day at National Research Council" which you published last August. There are now some interesting new developments with respect to availability of UFO information to the public. I made another visit to NRC recently to keep myself up to date and was quite surprised by what I found. Unfortunately, Millman was in Europe at the time so I could not get any answers to my questions. He is due back this week and I intend to visit him. It seems that I may have discovered the existence of a special set of files, for public consumption only, and I am very disturbed by this. Whatever the facts of the case, the file situation is radically different now than a year ago, and I suspect that it may be a direct result of my public exposure of mismanagement in my article referred to above. I also passed that article to the Ottawa Citizen and they wrote it up, which may have caused some embarrassment to certain people resulting in the screws being tightened.

However, this is all really speculation at the moment. I cannot give you any facts now other than the great change in the presentation of the files to the public. As usual, this is in confidence until I learn all the story. I have mentioned it also to John Magor, as he wanted to reprint my article in his magazine, but I declined permission as I can probably write a new one to bring the story up to date.

The case I am looking into at present is the same one you are - Neal, Victoria, Sept. 29/68. I have one slide and I am trying to have an analysis carried out by DND, or NRC. Will keep you informed.

We will not now be able to make it to Winnipeg this summer, due to various reasons. Perhaps next year.
