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Dear Member and Subscriber:

This letter is for those of you who have been concerned about our lagging publication schedule, and the resultant confusion over the numerical representation (month and year) that we have been using for a renewal code on your APRO Bulletin address label.

This date did NOT indicate the actual date that you were due to renew. The date DID indicate the date of the first Bulletin you were to receive upon renewal of your subscription. This was based on the assumption that we could get out 12 issues (six-double issues) per year, originally. Our literature has stated that our dues were \$12.00 (within the U.S.) per "year".

Your dues entitle you to 12 issues (six double-issues) of the Bulletin, even if it takes 18 months or two years to get them all to you.

Because of the above mentioned confusion and the fact that several Members and Subscribers have felt that they were receiving "old" news when they received the current Bulletin, we have decided to drop the month and year (except for the publishing date) from the cover of our Bulletin, and use only the Volume and Number.

The Bulletins mailed early this month, Volume 29, Nos. 1 & 2, are the current Bulletins even though dated July and August, 1980. Our next double-issue will be Volume 29, Nos. 3 & 4, and we will take it from there.

Mr. Bray { This necessitates changing the renewal code on your address label (once again). In the future the code will indicate the FIRST issue that the Member and/or Subscriber will receive upon renewal. For example, if your subscription ends with Volume 30, Nos. 1 & 2, the first double-issue you would receive upon renewal would be Volume 30, Nos. 3 & 4, so your renewal code would be 30/3.

The main thing we wish to put across is that you will receive your full quota of Bulletins for your money paid, and that each Bulletin will be current.

Thank you for writing us of your concern, and we want you to know that we really appreciate your patience.
