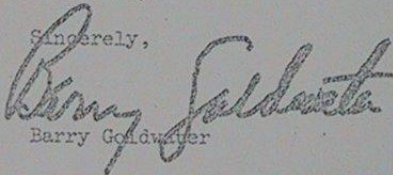
Dear Mr. Graham:
