Thank you for your letter of June 21 and also for returning your previous letter to me, and I shall hope that the Memorial Edition of Topside and Wilbert B. Smith's book "The New Science" will prove of interest and assistance to you in your study. We shall look forward to your comments in due course.

I have since given some thought to the question you raised as to whether WBS turned away from orthodox scientific work to the more metaphysical aspects of what he termed "The New Science" and I would like to emphasize that this was not the case. He carried on his normal scientific work and at the same time delved into the Science of Metaphysics as a possible answer to the UFO mystery which apparently produced some concrete results in the laboratory. In this connection, I enclose a copy of the Editorial which appeared in the Winter, 1968 issue of Topside, which may possibly shed a little further light on WBS's scientific approach on these two levels.

In the realm of purely orthodox science, among other projects, WBS was working actively on the development of an anti-gravity device and believed himself to be on the verge of an important "breakthrough" just prior to his death.

I trust that this information may be of some help to you in arriving at an objective evaluation of the scientific work of the late Wilbert B. Smith.
