Dear Comdr. Bray:

As I promised during our phone conversation last month I am sending you the information on UFO sightings at Lake Kipissing and Maxville Ontario during 1967. These stories were related to me by two technologists at the Forest Products Laboratory where I am employed as a Research Scientist.

The first incident took place near Sturgeon Falls, Lake Kipissing on June 3. A Semical technologist at our Laboratory had been fishing on the lake that day with some friends. They were in the lakeside cottage that evening when a Mr. Arcand entered quite pale looking and agitated at about 11.45 P.M. Mr. Arcand has been employed for several years to check the buoy lights marking the rocks dangerous to boats on the lake at night. He repeatedly his story several times to the others in the cottage although he thought that they might laugh at him for seeing sees.

His story was that he was proceeding between two small islands in his boat when he noticed two green lights on the water and a white light a little behind and between the green lights. His estimation was that the green lights were some 7 feet apart. At first he thought that someone might be having trouble with his boat. This sighting apparently took place near Oak Island. He approached to within about 100 feet of the lights when they suddenly arose from the water with a "whoosh" and
