

into the southeastern sky at about a 45-degree angle. The object made no noise, did not affect the car, and gave off enough light to illuminate the ground beneath it. It was observed for approximately 10 minutes. At least one other car with 3 or 4 passengers passed by Mr. Pelletier as he was observing the object. But as of this date no independent reports have come to my attention.

Shortly before this sighting a number of reports came in which turned out to be caused by flares. However, Mr. Pelletier says he is quite familiar with flares (in fact had seen them earlier that night), and that this object acted quite differently.

4) An anonymous woman living in Priddis, Alberta (about 10 miles SW of Calgary) has observed UFOs on seven different evenings according to the latest news report on TV. She will not release her name, and the following description of the first 5 sightings is based on a written report received from her. At the time of writing this, she is still unknown to me.

About midnight the 13th of October 1974 she noticed 3 objects in the western sky through her bedroom window. The lights appeared "to be moving around" and she watched them with binoculars and a small telescope through the open window. She says they were travelling about "at great speed", and that as they darted closer she had to refocus the telescope. One of the three objects came as close as 150 yards from the farmhouse. When it did it disturbed all the livestock, and illuminated the area around it, as well as the inside of the house. Sometimes it hovered; sometimes it moved at great speed. It appeared to be solid, and made a whinning noise. She estimated it to have been 60 feet in diameter, and 20 or 25 feet in height. It had red "clearance lights" and "windows" all around. Light came from the interior as well as from the lights. She estimates she observed the three objects for two and a half hours.
