PROCEEDINGS OF THE 1976 CUFOS CONFERENCE (1976, 320 pages)

This volume contains the complete text of 35 papers submitted to the CUFOS conference held April 30-May 2, 1976 in Lincolnwood, Illinois. The papers range from general discussions to highly technical reports, and include case investigations. Also included are 27 pages of bibliographical material, and lists of cases involving such features as animal reaction, abductions, features of humanoids, categories of landing traces, etc.

A CATALOGUE OF 200 TYPE-I UFO EVENTS IN SPAIN AND PORTUGAL, Vicente-Juan Ballester-Olmos (1976, 77 pages)

This catalogue gives brief summaries of 200 landing or near landing UFO cases dating from 1914 to January, 1975, along with the source(s) of information and references to additional material, where available. First-hand information obtained directly from witnesses comprises 67% of the cases. Also included are photos and drawings of 18 separate cases, charts illustrating the temporal and geographic distribution of cases, and references to over 100 books, periodicals, organizations and individuals.

THE LUMBERTON REPORT--UFO ACTIVITY IN SOUTHERN NORTH CAROLINA, April 3-9, 1975, Jennie Zeidman (1976, 59 pages).

In this six-day period there were at least 57 separate UFO events reported over an area of approximately 5000 square miles by at least 48 police officers and an unknown number of private citizens. Remarkably consistent descriptions were given of two apparently distinct phenomena. This report describes the immediate investigation conducted by two Center investigators, and the follow-up by the author on the spot. Maps, charts, sketches and photographs of physical traces are included.

PASSPORT TO MAGONIA From Folklore to Flying Saucers, Jacques Vallee. Chicago: Henry Regnery Company, 1969. (372 pages)

In the author's words, "This book...is an effort to provide systematic documentation and literary illustration of modern folklore in the perspective of ancient myths and traditional literary material." An appendix lists a catalog of 923 unexplained UFO landings.

THE INVISIBLE COLLEGE, Jacques Vallee. New York: E. P. Dutton & Co., 1976. (216 pages)

A possible connection among the psychic components of some UFO reports, "extra-terrestrial" communications and religious revelations is presented and discussed, along with aspects of UFO research and the author's theory that UFOs are part of a control system.
