

International UFO authority called for

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SPECIAL TO THE NEWS WORLD

The world needs an international ufo authority, before it is too late!

We believe it is time that the public realize that the UFO problem cannot be solved by scientists or by private research organizations, because governments are the only factors capable of assuming decisive responsibility.

Yes — in these most critical times, where nations are armed to the teeth ready to devour each other, ALL governments are constrained not only to tell the truth about UFOs, but also to act immediately towards finding a cooperative avenue of approach in coping with the pressing problem of UFOs.

On January 28, 1981 and September 28, 1981, in view of the government's continuing silence, ICUFON, PPCC, the SBI and IGAPF filed two memorandums with President Reagan and the National Security Council supported by twenty declassified UFO-related documents from the Pentagon and foreign military forces.

UN authority

The Memorandums urged the United States to initiate a call to all nations for an international congress on global security.

This step was suggested by many military authorities of a number of European countries. It was further suggested that guidelines could be developed for finding solutions to the UFO problem, and that at the Global Security Congress national delegates would represent their respective countries in the following areas:

- a/ Military Defense with respect to national security;
- b/ Science and Technology with respect to scientific views;
- c/ UFO research pioneers and UFO organizations regarding civilian research and investigation, as well as liaison with the public.

In order to comprehend the global situation posed by UFOs, it was suggested that all cooperating nations raise the curtain of secrecy only with respect to UFOs. This would provide both world-wide UFO data as well as a planetary perspective.

A warning

This material confirmed the warning concerning the potential threat created by UFOs given in June 1978 at a conference of the International Security Department of the US State Department. On that occasion the Chief of the department, Dr. Michael Mishaud, and the Chief Scientist, Dr. Irvin Picus, sounded the following warning:

"Aliens from other solar systems are a potential threat to us and we are a potential threat to them." Ask not, are ufos friendly or hostile, but rather, why is your nation firing upon ufos?

President Ronald Reagan calls upon all nations to remove the nightmare of a nuclear holocaust from the world, and says he is ready to discuss a third Strategic Arms Reduction Treaty (START) with the Soviet Union in Geneva, aiming at a reasonable

reduction in the nuclear arsenal. Yet, over the past decade both the USA and the USSR have secretly increased, rather than decreased, their offensive strategic arms production!

Where is the enemy on earth which cannot be destroyed with conventional weapons and requires instead a massive nuclear arsenal, including ICBMs on the ground and in the air. Such space weaponry is the predominant possession of the world's two space-exploring superpowers.

Since World War II, all of mankind have based their hopes for survival on the gamble that somehow the winner of such a nuclear war will only experience moderate annihilation.

Is it possible for nuclear scientists and military strategists of both superpowers to ignore the fact that the initial phase of a savage atomic war would totally destroy not only both antagonists but also their allies as well?

Is that the reason for the horrendous buildup of nuclear arsenals that would ultimately dig the grave for all of civilization?

Or is this buildup of destructive force justified in terms of another, common, enemy?

The only possible enemy that could justify the necessity of the "overkill" arsenals of the USA and USSR was unequivocally and starkly defined by Mishaud and Picus in their 1978 statement.

This public (and instantly suppressed) declaration of the State Department should have awakened the conscience of every nation of the world that the USA was preparing for an offensive space war so that it could strike back with strategic arms against any potential threat of the aliens from other solar systems.

After more than three decades of a government policy of suppression and silence regarding UFOs, it now seems crystal clear that the reason for the emergency need for more strategic arms material is precisely this "denied" threat to us from outer space.

On the other hand, a misinformed and ignorant public has been pacified by the soothing statements that there are many differing theories regarding the nature and intentions of UFOs. These theories offer absolutely no real security against the potential danger — far greater than any terrestrial conflict — which could easily be triggered one day by some frightened soldier's reflexive and defensive firing of a missile at a UFO!

This thirty-year governmental policy was sharply characterized by NATO Air Force Major (Retired) Hans C. Petersen of Denmark, who stated in his Petition from Europe to President Reagan:

"Since World War II, the policy concerning UFOs by the United States has created a tragic example of how an otherwise great nation can keep the world in the darkness of the Middle Ages."

In February 1966, UN Secretary General U Thant pondered the possibility of keeping the international nature of the UFO problem under

United Nations control, and to establishing the necessary security measures to achieve it.

But in June 1966, Soviet Ambassador Dr. Trofimovich Fedorenko helped thwart Thant's humanitarian project by declaring that "ufos are nightmares of the imperialists and [the] capitalist countries."

Fourteen years later the Soviet National Academy of Sciences' Institute of Space Studies contradicted the Ambassador's flagrantly misleading statement when it published information indicating that the Soviet Union was, by September 19, 1967, already deeply involved in monitoring UFO operations over the Soviet Union through its entire astronomical network at the direction of the highest Soviet military leaders.

As President of the United States and Chairman of the National Security Council, Ronald Reagan gave no formal response (or even confirmation of the receipt of) the above-mentioned Memorandums or the proposal for an International Congress on Global Security.

In similar fashion, the National Security Council failed to respond to the request of the President of PPCC, Jerome Eden, for a personal conference with the NSC in order to explore the possibilities and concrete steps that could lead to a solution to the UFO problem.

NSC acts

A drastic response of quite another kind, however, followed on the heels of this move. The National Security Council reacted by prohibiting any further release of UFO-related documents under the Freedom of Information Act. Government attorneys argued that these top-secret documents would reveal highly classified "electronic monitoring and interception techniques" used by the USA — in other words, America's capability to effectively detect and destroy interplanetary space craft!

It will be recalled that a weapons-effectiveness test was conducted in summer 1952 by an F-86 jet fighter, Capt. R. R. Ruppel, former head of Project Blue Book, notes this in his book, *The Report on UFOs*. Three years later, in 1955, General Benjamin Chidlaw, former head of the US Continental Air Defense, stated to the

journalist R.C. Gardner that "We have lost many men and planes trying to intercept them (UFOs)."

One would be fully justified to add nearly three more decades of American fighter planes and pilots to the "losses" mentioned by General Chidlaw, but our "weapons-test program" against UFOs continues, for example, one of the most recent incidents that we are aware of occurred on June 3, 1980 between a Peruvian Air Force jet aircraft and a UFO.

The North American Air Defense Command (NORAD) has admitted that its sophisticated Infrared Sensors, Synchronized Satellite Entries, and phased array of Global Radar Networks register daily about 800 to 900 "objects" whose flight characteristics do not resemble any satellites nor do they have the usual ballistic trajectories.

We accept the possibility that the majority of these "objects" detected are generated by meteor-tail phenomena, electromagnetic impulses, re-entering satellite debris and other anomalous propagations.

Nevertheless, having accepted all of the "known" or possibly "known" phenomena, we still have a modest ten percent of phenomena which fall into the category of "unidentified" objects — those observed with the naked eye by bonafide observers, reported by the international news media (or the local press), or photographed by ordinary people with inexpensive equipment. Some are verified by simple artifacts, or finally revealed in declassified UFO-related documents. One can safely conclude that every hour of every day, more than three UFOs intrude into our global airspace on "assignments" unknown to members of the human race.

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
