as a matter of fact - this year's program is the raising of money to carry out many of the research projects we have proposed to accomplish.

In addition to the original "Invisible College" scientists - we have heard from many other scientists who report that while they had never joined any other UFO organization in the past - they were now offering their expertise and in many cases the laboratory facilities available to them for Center analysis.

A local businessman has made available to the Center, a WATTS line covering the eastern 3/4 of the U.S. including all that area east of the Rocky Mountains.

The Center provides the most complete catalog of available books and documents of the government and serious authors of the academic and scientific community. All of this material is available through the Center.

With the assistance of Dr. David Saunders, the Center under the direction of Irving Anderson, is developing a computer catalog similar to his own UFOCAT. Preliminary study of his UFOCAT reveals the tremendous advantages that a computer printout has over the normal listings which cannot detail all the possibilities that are available with computer coding.

For example, not only is date, time, location and number of witnesses available, but much more.

We are able to provide location, not only with relation to country, state, and city, but also by geographic coordinates of latitude and longitude. Time is shown in both local time and GMT.

Relative to the UFO craft, we not only detail the shape, size and color, we have expanded the coding to include structural detail, such as ports, markings, lights, formation, duration of sighting, actions of the UFO and the presence of odor or sound.

Information about witnesses include such details as number of witnesses, names, ages, feelings, actions and reactions, physical or mental effects, and were there any after effects.

Landing case information offers the details of physical traces on the ground, and flora damage.

Occupant's details would include size, shape, features, clothing, actions, odors, sound, color, tools or instruments, and was there any contact either physical, mental or oral.

Many other features are available. Animal reaction, radar, E.M. interference cases and of vital importance, when a case is not a first hand report, what is the source of the report.

In all, we have 450 categories with approximately 30 possibilities, within each category.

In closing, let me make three (3) points:
