Hi Grant.

Is Donald Goodspeed the person who forwarded a piece
of a flying
saucer to Wilbert B. Smith which had been shot at
over Washington
D.C. in 1952 and which was later returned by Smith
to some
authority higher than the USAF?

I did a quick search of the staff/faculty directories
at both
York University and University of Toronto and I did
not find
anyone with the last name of Goodspeed. I did not
find anyone by
the name of Donald Goodspeed listed in the 1999/2000
telephone
white pages either. Are you sure of the spelling?
If you do
find the letter from Zechel please let me know what
subjects
Donald Goodspeed would have taught at the university
so I can
contact some of the older faculty members at both
universities

who are likely to have known him and may still know where he lives or works.

If we do manage to track Donald Goodspeed down, please let me know the best way you think I should contact him and the type of questions to ask. Although I do not have anything interesting such as photos of a crashed flying saucer and aliens like the ones Henry Azadehdel has and tried to bait Dr. Eric A. Walker with, I was able to track down someone who has such photos. Paul Newdick, President of International Home Show in Toronto, allegedly worked on DND's UFO photo collection sometime after he graduated from the Photographic Arts Program in 1977 from Toronto's third university, Ryerson Polytechnical Insitute. Although the source of this lead was John Bliss, a Hamilton area fireman and fellow classmate of Paul Newdick, Paul denied that he did any work for DND when I spoke with him in person after he ignored several letters I sent to him earlier.

It is an interesting coincidence that in 1977 individuals with the Canadian military and U.S. Naval Intelligence approached someone living north of Toronto (I can't recall the name of this individual or the place) who nearly ran over an alien with his vehicle (Michel Deschamps spoke about him last Sunday on Errol's SDI radio show, a case which was researched in much detail by CUFORN). They showed him an album filled with UFO photos and suggested that his UFO experience was an accident.

If Donald Goodspeed like Paul Newdick denies that he had any official involvement with UFOs, then he will not get any further leads in our search for the truth about UFOs.

Heidi Klose, our Administrative Assistant, passed on to me your e-mail concerning Donald Goodspeed. Don retired from the Department in 1984.

and, I regret to say, died in 1990. The Donald J. Goodspeed Book Prize for HIST 1F95 was established in his memory by his family. HIST 1F95, an introductory course in world history in the 20th century, is the approximate successor to a roughly equivalent course that Don taught while he was at Brock---our first introductory course, HIST 100, "The Past Hundred Years". Don also taught courses in military history.

I hope this information is of use to you; if I can be of any further assistance, do let me know. I believe his widow, Edith, still lives in Niagara on the Lake, though I am not absolutely certain of this.
