Dear Bill,

Many thanks for your interesting letters about the Quebec Object. Art Bridge took it and has been working on it for the past two weeks. His first try was like mine, to cut off a piece on the power saw. All that happened was a shower of sparks and saw teeth! He eventually had to use a tungsten wire saw and abrade off some samples. He got a friend in Mines and Technical Surveys to make a spectroscopic analysis of the sample and got the verdict that it was Magnesium Ferrite. Now, this material is a purely artificial product, made with some considerable effort, and does NOT occur free in Nature to the best of our knowledge, nor is it a "byproduct". The only use for it that I can find is in missile nose cones and rocket motor linings, as it is reasonably resistant to ablation.

A close inspection of the surface shows the inclusion of large numbers of very small particles, most of which seem to be light metal silicates. The density of these particles (on the outer surface only) is about 30 per square centimeter. Dr. Peter Milman advises that micrometeorites of this size would occur through a sq. cm. section at about  $10^{-6}$  second so it would take about a year to accumulate such a density.

Your statement about CARDE and the blast furnace does not sound quite right, as it does not seem to me reasonable that scrap from a blast furnace would warrant any unusual method of disposal. Usually, such material is dumped as near as possible to its source, usually within a quarter mile. I am quite sure that the Department of Transport would take a VERY DIM VIEW of dumping such material in the St Lawrence River! However, if CARDE stick to their story, then they should have no objection to either turning the whole Gubbins over to us or allowing us free access to it. Would you look into this angle, please?

how did you make out about there being a second larger piece further out in the river, near the shipping channel? If this is correct and such a piece can be located, I think I can interest some DOT people to lift it. I think we have enough to stimulate an interest.

Many thanks for your efforts which I am sure will prove most worth while when all the facts are in. Meanwhile, we will drop a series of notes from time to time as we get anything significant.

I am answering your letter of Oct. 19, on a personal basis, as the official Project Magnet has been discontinued. I am enclosing a Statement regarding this matter.

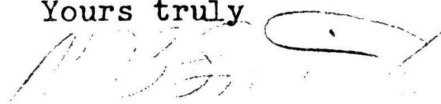
I am glad indeed that you are forming a group to investigate seriously the significance of the UFO phenomena, and I wish you every success. With respect to your particular questions I would like to answer both in the affirmative, although I do not know how I might help.

Through my own investigations I have come to the following conclusions; Saucers are real, they are extraterrestrial, they are manned or directed by intelligent beings, these beings are friendly and want to help us. Mixed in with authentic material is a tremendous amount of "garbage" and the big job of the investigator is to sort the grain from the chaff. Furthermore, I believe that a completely open mind is necessary; a mind prepared to investigate ALL leads no matter how illogical or fantastic they may seem at first sight, and to follow them wherever they may go.

There is one point on which I would like to comment, and that is with regard to the inclusion of science fiction in your activities. While this is very interesting, entertaining, and sometimes contributes quite useful ideas, nevertheless, if associated with a serious project there is a natural tendency to class the whole thing as fiction. If it is felt that there is a need for such an outlet then I feel that it should be kept well away from the more serious aspect.

Dear Mr. Myer,

I am sorry that I have been so long in answering your letter of August 9th, but I have been quite busy lately with my office work generally.

As you may have heard the Government decided to drop all further official investigation of the flying saucer phenomenon, but I am carrying on with the work as a purely private project. There were a number of reasons behind this decision which I can't go into, but they did not include lack of results.

With reference to Major Keyhoe's book and the references therein to our work, I must say that the statements are substantially correct. You will note that the line of speculation which he features is based entirely on the supposition that a 'magnetic sink' can be established. The rest follows directly. The only trouble is that we have so far found no way to make such a sink.

I am personally convinced that the saucers are real, that they are operated by intelligences more advanced than we are, that they are not hostile, and that they would associate with us if they could be convinced that we were not savages at heart.

We are gradually learning a good deal from our studies, but we feel that it is quite premature to make any disclosures as to what we have found out. We hope that we will be in a more favorable position in the not too distant future.

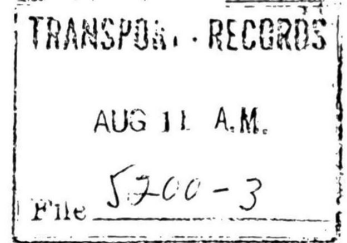

This letter may be impertinent, but I would appreciate hearing from you and learn whether you substantiate within reason the statements made by Major Keyhoe.

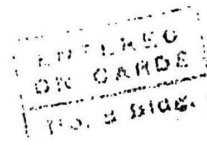

I was very pleased to get your Christmas card and note, and I want to thank you very much for remembering. I am afraid that I don't do as well as I should in these matters. Somehow, I manage to get involved in a great many more things than I really have capacity to look after, so things just slide.

If all goes as expected, we hope to visit California this year. I have a month furlough leave which I hope to use for a trip with my family out west, to the Calgary Stampede, World's Fair, California, and Yellowstone Park. As yet we have not established an itinerary as there is so much we want to see and do, and a month isn't very long.

I am very sorry about the Topside, but obviously there was an oversight somewhere. However, I am sending herewith the back copies which I have available, and definitely putting your name on the mailing list. The publication isn't much but it expresses the views of some of our club members.

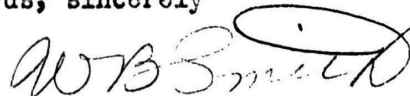
We have been doing a little research work here on gravity control but find that we must learn a bit more, so we are now looking in that direction. We have been holding classes to try and spread the knowledge we have of the new science, but it is slow hard work. We actually have the science from the Creator's position in "Nothing at all" to the actuality of matter and energy as we recognize them, and from here on it is mostly a matter of welding the old to the new, with revisions to the old where necessary.

By the way, do you have Dan Fry's current address? I have written to his old address but got no reply and I would like to discuss certain matters with him pertaining to this new science.

We have also been doing some work in the investigation of borderland areas through hypnosis, with quite interesting results. We found for example that, viewed from the outside, this Universe hasn't the substance of a good healthy shadow! It is all an Idea or Concept of the Creator, but most amazingly and logically established. Regression is something we want to do but haven't really got going on it yet.

About a year ago we came into possession of a chunk of metal, about 3000 pounds which appeared on the shore of the St. Lawrence River under circumstances which could not be explained by normal means. It is a high strength manganese steel, fabricated in layers of .01 to .8 in thick and looks like the whole has been subject to impact such as if it fell on a hard surface with very high velocity. 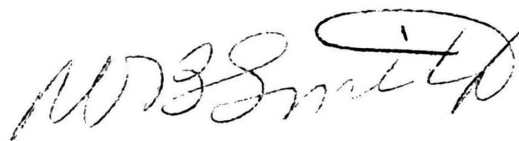
Dear Mr. Daniels,-

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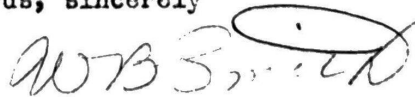

Thanks for your letter of Dec. 5.

I don't know if I can be of much help to you in your UFO studies. My own experience has been that one must look wherever the indications appear. I find that when these people from outside want to contact anyone they will arrange it, and there is nothing that we can do about it. Even such a little thing as a sky watch, is seldom as fruitful as having everyone keeping their eyes open.

We have a flying saucer discussion club here, which meets every second Tuesday in the month. The club dues goes for magazine subscriptions, books etc. There is so much material published these days that it is almost a full time job reading it all.

A research program is very meritorious but can run into a lot of money. We are carrying on a very small such program on gravity research, and have some results but as yet nothing spectacular. All we have done so far is to establish that WE CAN MONKEY WITH GRAVITY. Further research will be carried out as time and funds permit. We have also made a number of instruments to detect vortices wherein the binding forces within matter are altered. The instruments work quite well, but their usefulness depends on people using them in the field. They are very simple consisting of a nylon fiber wrapped a couple of turns around a spindle carrying a pointer, and stressed to nearly its breaking point by a spring which is stressed well below its elastic limit. An arbitrary scale is provided just to keep track of the pointer position.

Astronomically, I think your best bet is continual visual observation of the moon, and if you have a big enough telescope available, time spent looking at Mars may not be wasted. Other sky watching is best done with naked eyes augmented by  $7\frac{1}{2}$  power binoculars when something is spotted. As accurate timing of phenomenae as is possible together with precise positioning can be of value in subsequent analysis.

I am afraid that the above is about all the advice I can offer. I shall be pleased to hear from you and will be looking forward to meeting you in person.

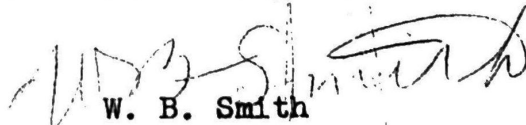

Dear Mr. Ford,

I shall try to answer your letter asking for information on flying saucers, but I am afraid that I shall not be able to tell you very much.

I am convinced that the saucers are real; that they are alien vehicles; that they are manned by people very much like ourselves, and that they are for the most part friendly. I the worst they are probably quite disinterested in us.

Much of the current saucer literature is in my opinion, irresponsible, but there are a number of publications which I think are sincere and factual, such as Keyhoe, Adamski, Jessop, Cramp, Fry, Williamsom, etc.

I have seen flying saucers myself, but my own sightings have been in no way outstanding, and are very similar to hundreds of others which are well known and have been described in the literature.

I have no objection to being quoted accurately. I have been studying the flying saucer phenomenon actively since 1950, and the technological principles which seem to be closely related for much longer than that. I am convinced that these principles when completely evaluated will so extend our basic knowledge that we too can travel through space at will.

You will realize that I have told you very little but much of the information which I hold is such that it must remain confidential for the present. Someday I sincerely hope that it may be made public, but in the meantime this meagre bit will have to suffice.

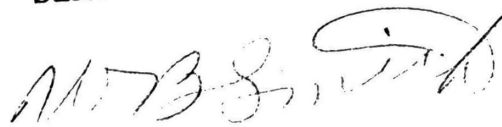
Dear Mr. Dickey,

I was much interested in your letter of May 21, and to note your interest in transcendental phenomenae. I am sorry that I can't direct you to any source of information on the field structure of matter, as this information is largely in the hands of a very few people and is not to be generally released at this time. Later it will be the basis of a new science.

I can tell you this much, however. Our universe is a twelve dimensional concept, made of four fabrics of three dimensions each. The space fabric is rather familiar to us, but we don't know much about the field fabric, and still less about the control fabric and the intention fabric. The field fabric contains three basic aspects or fields of the fundamental concept which we may call, electric, magnetic, and tempic. These fields are the dimensions within which the electrical, magnetic and time phenomenae take place. The tempic field is the basic field which causes the entropy change which our clocks measure. Our ideas of time are not quite as accurate as they might be.

To understand these things, I would suggest that you look well within your self, towards those things which you know instinctively to be true, and try to fit together what you find. If you do this to the best of your ability, I think you will find the answers. If you will think upon these things you will understand better my references to time, temperature and gravity. When you have passed this milestone I shall be glad to try and point the way to the next.

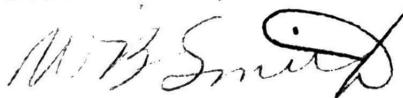
With respect to the rumors about Project Magnet having licked the force field problems, just don't believe all you hear. Let us say that we have "Acquired knowledge" and let it go at that.

These articles will deal with certain astronomical matters, basic science and philosophy, and I hope the timing will mesh with events which will be significant. 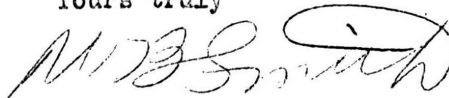
I finally got around to answering your letter, and to try and explain my position with respect to the gravity research project underway here.

In the first place, we are no where near being able to produce a gravity motor, and I am not altogether sure that this can be done in precisely this way. I believe that eventually we will be able to make use of energy differentials in nature which are inaccessible to us at the present time, but in no case will we ever "get something for nothing". Our hydro power is an example of using energy differentials but we still have to pay a hydro bill.

Our work here is directed to learning the rules for gravity control. We know what gravity is, and something about its behaviour, but we have much to learn yet before we will even be able to lift a brick. So far our work has resulted in gravity control of about 1%, so you see, we have at least 99% to go.

I am sorry that I haven't anything more substantial to offer at the present time, but I hope that eventually we will be able to learn enough about gravity to put it to work for us.

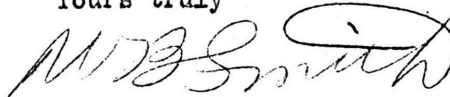
