Dear Sir:

Reference is made to my letters of October 4 and November 5, 1969, addressed to the Chairman, Senate Committee on Science Policy, and the reply from the Honourable Maurice Lamontagne dated November 10, 1969.

In a telephone conversation with you during the month of August, I was informed that all briefs submitted to the Committee would be published, whether presented at the Hearings or not. My brief, "Science, Society and the UFO", was not presented at the Hearings, but you assured me it would be published nevertheless. On the strength of your assurance, I promised a copy to quite a number of organizations which requested one. Now it appears, that to fulfill my promise, I must reproduce copies at my own expense, despite the fact I spent a great many hours of hard work preparing my brief at the open invitation of the Senate Committee.

I note, from article I.7 of the Guideline for Submission of Briefs and Participation in Hearings, that there is some restriction concerning release of these briefs. I will appreciate information as to this situation as I desire to make the contents of my brief known to others as soon as possible.
