Dear Mr. Good:

Thank you for your letter of August 19, 1981, and for your order for a copy of my book The UFO Connection. This was sent by air mail a couple of weeks ago. You should have it by now.

Your book on George Adamski sounds very interesting indeed and I offer you encouragement to complete it. I happen to believe, also, that there is more to his story than is apparent. Certainly, the whole case has never been presented. I hope you can do so!

As for publishing your book, I can only say "no", but only because I do not have the resources to do so. Jupiter Publishing (which published my book) happens to be my wife and myself. We set this up for the sole purpose of publishing this one book. (Similarly, Bray Book Service published my first book in 1967). We did this entirely at our own expense, and have not yet recovered our investment. It is purely a part-time business as I am otherwise fully employed.

You will see from this that I am simply unable to publish your book.

I do believe your book should be published but if you cannot find a publisher (as I could not) my only advice is to do it yourself as I did. Self-publishing is costly and time-consuming, but there are some advantages, along with the disadvantages. For instance, you are in full control. You don't have editors tearing your work to shreds, for one thing. (We all know what editors, who know nothing of the subject matter, can do to other people's work).
