Dear Dr. Sprinkle:

Thank you for your kind letter of May 12th. It was good of you to write.

I think perhaps there is a little misunderstanding about what I said concerning 99.5% of sightings not being reported. In my brief to the Senate, page 80-72, I said "over 99.5% failed to report the phenomena to the US Air Force." I realize that many more sightings are reported to many other places. But to clarify further, I arrived at my figure in this way:

approximately 5,000,000 adult Americans have seen UFOs
- (Gallup, 1966)

12,097 sightings reported to US Air Force - (Bluebook, 1968)

This latter figure is approximately .24% of 5,000,000, so on this basis I think I was correct in my statement that over 99.5% do not report to the US Air Force.

If you are not in agreement with me now, I do hope you will let me know as I would not like to be thought of as trying to mislead anyone.
