Has there been an issue of your excellent NEWSLETTER since the No. 19 which was the latest I have received? I am looking forward to receiving these NEWSLETTERS.

UFO activity has been keeping at its usual level in Canada. We should be hearing the results of the Colorado University Committee in a few months. This should be very interesting, but I am sure it will sweep it all under the rug. Perhaps you have heard that the U.S. House of Representatives held a hearing at the end of July, and a number of Famous scientists gave very strong testimony in favour of the interplanetary hypothesis. This was well written up in the latest issue of The UFO Investigator of NICAP. Do you get a copy of this paper?

I am currently preparing a detailed brief for presentation to the Canadian Senate Committee on Science Policy which is currently holding hearings on all aspects of science in Canada. The UFO problem has received very little attention from our government and I am trying to put some pressure on.

I hear that Cathie's book can now not be published in New Zealand and is to be published in Hong Kong soon. It would appear that some sort of pressure has been applied. Do you know what has happened in this respect? I would appreciate any details you may happen to have.
