

THE DYFED ENIGMA: UNIDENTIFIED FLYING OBJECTS IN WEST WALES by Randall Jones Pugh and F.W. Holiday (1979, 186 pages)

The story of a concentration of UFO incidents that occurred in a small area (the Dyfed area) of Wales, U.K. Many of the events involved surprising and disturbing effects on animals. The authors speculate about the origin of the UFO phenomenon and in one chapter discuss a correlation between the locations of the incidents and projections of "ley lines."

REPORT ON UNIDENTIFIED FLYING OBJECTS by Edward J. Ruppelt (1956, 243 pages) (A limited number of used copies are available)

In this book, significant because it was the first time anyone in an official capacity indicated a serious interest in the UFO phenomenon publicly, Captain Ruppelt provides some background on the establishment of "Project Blue Book" and the reaction of official Washington to the vexing question of UFOs. He includes a good sampling of the UFO sightings of the early fifties, reporting them objectively and leaving open the question of their identity.

In a second edition four years later, three more chapters were added with more information about sightings, contactees (including Adamski), and a conclusion that UFOs are a "space age myth." A photocopied insert of these additional chapters is included with each copy.

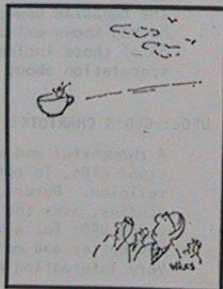

Dr. Rutledge, a physicist, used instrumented observations whenever possible and classifies and summarizes his results.
