On the status of Gen. Schweitzer:

General Schweitzer was not removed or dismissed on his delicate position at the White House and NSC. He was transferred a higher position to the "OPERATION PLANNING" in the Pentagon.

You should know as former military officer, when in a high position anyone is transferred to an other position he should be "clean up" the administration what he started or assigned for settlement, and then leave the office. That he answered to my Memorandum, is proven that 3 Memos was received in the White House on Sept. 28, November 4, the NSC, and Oct. 27th ^{by} Gen. Schweitzer. (See marking in PPCC Bul. I am certainly convinced that the General was instructed to the answer! I am sure in it that with 3 memorandums in his hand, he did ask the President for response... "to say something". Might be some others were also in-
