Dear Sir:

I am writing to you in reference to a major problem of concern to millions of people around the world, many of whom are Canadians. This matter is the phenomenon of Unidentified Flying Objects (UFOs).

It has been scientifically proved that UFOs exist. They have interfered with commercial and military aircraft (and have caused some to crash, with loss of life) and with automobiles on the highways, and have thrown a severe fright into many thousands of people in close-range encounters. All this is fact, well documented by many governments and scientists around the world. The major questions which remain unanswered are - what are they, where do they originate, and what are they doing?

Many governments have maintained an investigative program over a period of many years but little information is released to the public as to their findings. Even Russia is engaged in a scientific study of this problem. American astronauts have photographed UFOs in space (confirmed by NASA and by the astronauts themselves during press conferences). This demonstrates that the phenomenon is not solely an atmospheric one.

The problem, as I said, is world-wide, and this is part of the problem. In scientific research of this nature, it is necessary to search for patterns of activity. To date, many patterns have been established, including travel on great circle routes, colour and directional changes, speed, areas of terrestrial significance (a high proportion of sightings occur over missile sites, nuclear generating plants, electrical generating plants and transmission lines, as well as over major military installations of various types).
