

While, as you will note in the article, we do not claim that this chunk of metal is, in fact, a piece of UFO hardware, as certain elements of doubt and somewhat mysterious circumstances surround the finding of the hardware and the subsequent tests on it, we feel that it might be worthy of further investigation and tests, and in particular, a mass spectographic analysis to determine the number of isotopes in the various elements contained in the metal which might establish more clearly whether or not the material is of terrestrial origin.

If you feel that your group of scientists might be interested in conducting such experiments and tests on this metal, we would be happy to co-operate with you by sending you samples of the metal for analysis (although, as explained in the article, from other tests conducted which produced differing analyses, it would appear that the mass of metal is not homogeneous); or, if a more intensive investigation of the mass of metal is desired, to come to some arrangement whereby one of your scientists personally examines the hardware on site, or it is shipped to your laboratory for complete investigation. If the latter course were considered desirable, however, the shipment would have to be at your expense, because as explained in the article, this chunk of metal weighs around 3,000 pounds, and our Club would not be in a financial position to pay the cost of transport. The Ottawa New Sciences Club would, of course, appreciate the return courtesy of a detailed report on your findings after a thorough investigation of the metal, should you decide to avail yourselves of this opportunity.

If this offer is of interest to you and your group, I would appreciate hearing from you and shall be happy to co-operate in any way possible on any proposed investigation of the metal.

I would like to take this opportunity of wishing you and your group of scientists every success in your investigation of the UFO mystery and, along with what now amounts to several millions of people all over the world who claim to have witnessed UFO phenomena, sincerely hope that a factual and truthful report, with nothing concealed, will eventually be made available to the public at large.
