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Your idea how Smith met Sarbacher may be correct. Certainly I am in no position to dispute it. My question was: from whom did Smith learn about Vannevar Bush? Nobody knows the answer and nobody ever will. The reason I think it was Keyhoe is that Smith met Keyhoe several times while in Washington during that conference and discussed UFOs, and it was Keyhoe who was entrusted to take their joint article to Bush for comment (see Smith's notes), but apparently never did. Question: did Keyhoe personally know Bush?

I stand by my previous statement: that Keyhoe/Smith article was never published.

Who is the person who attended all the secret meetings at Wright-Patterson? Are you going to reveal, or do we have to put up with yet another anonymous witness?

MJ-12 has now got terminal cancer. It remains only to write its epitaph, but it won't be me that writes it. Three dozen new witnesses to Roswell? I would be more likely to believe you had three dozen new UFO denizens been found, alive and speaking with a US accent.

Yes, Vannevar Bush was the chief scientist of MJ-12, as per the documents. I don't think a military head was actually named; Hillenkoetter merely prepared the briefing to Ike. The political head was presumably Forrestal (or was it Truman?). The sole reason the forger chose Bush as the chief scientist was because the 1950 Smith memo named Bush. The forger used the Smith memo as a starting point for the whole MJ-12 fraud.

Bill Moore obtained the Smith memo in 1979 (from Friedman).
