Dear Mr. VonKeviczky,

On behalf of the Secretary-General, I acknowledge receipt of your letter of 23 June 1982 and enclosure.

The Secretary-General appreciates sharing your views concerning unidentified flying objects. He regrets, however, that his heavy schedule of other official duties prevent him from replying personally or from making comments on the content of your letter.

The Secretary-General has asked me to inform you that the United Nations can only act on proposals or suggestions presented to it by an official representative of a Member State. He is, therefore, unable to comply with your requests to permit you to present your views to the Member States of the United Nations or grant your Organization a personal visit with him. He would be delighted to meet with members of private organizations but time does not permit him to do so.

..... We are returning your folder of information to you since the United Nations cannot use it.
