Do you remember Gary Barker? I bet you probably don't, yet he was one of the most interesting figures in early ufology. He died in 1984, but his papers have been preserved. Professor Michael Swords visited the collection and writes about Barker and his escapades in the November/December issue of *IUR*. Barker's most famous book, *They Knew Too Much About Flying Saucers*, remains the best early discussion about reports of the Men-in-Black.

The current issue also contains a report by Richard Haines on a Soviet UFO sighting, plus an article by Ole Jonny Brænne, a prominent Norwegian UFO investigator, who explains once and for all whether or not there really was a saucer crash on Spitsbergen Island in June 1952.

"Inside Building 263: A Visit to Blue Book, 1956," in which Walter Webb discusses his never-before-revealed personal visit to interview Captain Gregory, head of the infamous Air Force project (September/October).
