

In Saskatchewan 9 newspapers were examined with negative results. In Alberta, 95 newspapers were examined. The search in Alberta uncovered a report in *The Didsbury Pioneer* for Wednesday, February 12, 1913, page 1, column headed "Around the Town". The quotation is as follows: "Mrs. L. A. Loveland and others reported witnessing a beautiful sight in the heavens on Sunday night about 7:15 p.m. It consisted of from ten to fifteen shooting stars which sent myriads of diamond-like smaller stars from west to east". The following item was noted in the same paper under date of February 19, 1913. "The *Toronto Globe* (daily) last week reported the fact that the shower of meteors reported in the *Pioneer* last week was also seen in Ontario, although it was about two hours earlier than they were seen here".

The second note in *The Didsbury Pioneer* is slightly mixed up. The observations in Ontario were shortly after 9:00 p.m. and were approximately simultaneous with those at Didsbury when account is taken of the difference in standard time between the two places. Because of the high velocity of a natural earth satellite, this is the result which should be expected. Didsbury is between Red Deer and Calgary at $114^{\circ}5'$ west and $51^{\circ}38'$ north. It is very close to the line drawn by Chant and is 500 kilometres west of the westernmost point previously known for these objects.

It would be highly desirable to examine the newspapers in Ontario and Quebec in the same way as those for the western provinces. There is probably no use in searching the newspapers in British Columbia because the shower would have occurred around 6:00 p.m. local time and the fireballs would probably have been obscured by sunlight.

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
