

B (21) Weather conditions

General remarks only are required concerning weather conditions as to whether or not there was any precipitation in the immediate vicinity, the extent of the visibility and the presence of clouds and a general description of the cloud formations. It is expected that accurate weather data from the Government Weather Offices will be available to provide the necessary information as to weather at the time of the sighting.

B (24) Other contributory evidence (photographic, electronic, etc.)

An effort should be made to uncover any evidence of a photographic, electronic, magnetic or radio active nature which might have some association with the sighting. The nature of such contributory evidence, when available, is bound to be of a highly specialized and probably quite local nature. No unusual happenings at the time or place of a sighting should be overlooked.

B (25) Any other details

In this respect a sketch, if possible, would be extremely helpful, the sketch need be only a line drawing showing the position, orientation and path taken by the object in relation to visible land marks. If the observer should happen to be close enough to the object to form an opinion as to its construction a sketch to an approximate scale would be extremely valuable.

C (27) Date and place of interrogation

Where an observer is being interrogated with respect to a sighting such interrogation should take place if at all possible at the actual place which the observer occupied at the time. In this manner positions, directions, elevations, etc. may be established much more accurately than if the interrogation took place elsewhere. It is realized that some sightings may take place from aircraft and if the exact time of the sighting is known the position of the aircraft may subsequently be determined.
