

The U.S. organization with the greatest potential is the Centre for UFO Studies and this is where I cast my major support. If all the organizations would band together under CUFOs, we might get somewhere in fairly short order. Fragmentation is our downfall in North America.

As for the potential Canadians have for investigating sightings properly, we have as much as the Americans. There is, of course, a right way and a wrong way to investigate, and it is vital to know the difference. Too many people "investigate" a case when they really don't know what they are doing. In my opinion, the greatest service any Canadian UFO group can perform is to educate their members on how to conduct an investigation properly. Reports should then be sent to CUFOs in Chicago for UFOCAT.

With respect to my brief to the Special Senate Committee on Science Policy, I believe it is now out of print, so I guess you are out of luck. I do not possess any more spare copies myself.

I note that the objectives of the UFO Research Centre: Ontario, and your own, are almost identical. Any chance that the two groups might join forces? This is all part of the fragmentation to which I referred earlier.

If you have issued any publications, I would be pleased to receive a copy of each and will, of course, pay for them.

This expresses my views as briefly as I can, in answer to your specific questions. I hope you may find these views of some interest.
