On 11/4/59, a telephone message was received by SA [redacted] of this office from [redacted] Hondo, Texas, advising that a [redacted] desired to report a matter to the FBI. (b)(7)(C)(D)

On 11/10/59, [redacted] was contacted at her residence. She advised as follows: (b)(7)(C)(D)

In about November 1957 she and her husband, who is [redacted] became interested in reports about "flying saucers" and became involved as a hobby. At Joske's in San Antonio, Texas, they bought two books, one entitled Inside The Space Ships by GEORGE ADAMSKI, published by American-Schuman, Inc., New York, and the other entitled Flying Saucers Have Landed by DESMOND LESLIE and GEORGE ADAMSKI, published by the British Book Center, 420 West 45th St., New York, New York. In one of these books, ADAMSKI claims he has been contacted by people from outer space and taken to other planets by them and that altogether there are 22,000 persons who have been contacted by these "space people." (b)(7)(D)

[redacted] said she wrote ADAMSKI, advising she found his books interesting and inquiring whether it was fiction or whether he believed his own story and ADAMSKI responded, stating it was true. Later, at ADAMSKI's request, [redacted] and her husband agreed to help him with his correspondence and since then they receive many letters forwarded to them by ADAMSKI which have been received by him from people in Texas and surrounding areas, asking questions about flying saucers and space people. ADAMSKI forwards the letters to [redacted] after acknowledging receipt and advising the writers that he is referring the inquiry to his "co-workers" who are "Acting Secretaries for Texas." [redacted] said ADAMSKI sent about 150 names of persons in Texas since she had made.
