

LATEST REVELATIONS FROM NSC CONSULTANT DR. MICHAEL WOLF

(March 09, 1999 12:01 PM)-- Late last week I received a phone call from Dr. Michael Wolf, consultant to the National Security Council's Special Studies Group, (popularly known as MJ-12.) He provided new information, and expanded on some previous disclosures. Wolf expanded on his previous revelation that a secret military spacecraft retrieved an extraterrestrial space beacon, dubbed The Monolith, from its position in space, and brought it back to Earth in 1972 for study. The U.S.'s removal of the powerfully-energized Monolith has caused our Moon to destabilize 2% from its normal axis. This in turn has adversely affected Earth's climate. Top International Security officials in communication with extraterrestrial representatives have requested them to restore the Moon to its proper axis. But the ETs have declined to help until the U.S. restores the space beacon to its original position in space. This is consistent with general ET policy of providing helpful advice, but not rescuing humankind from taking responsibility and action to correct our previous folly.

The conversation turned to a rash of recent reports of large anomalous objects spotted within our local region of space. Dr. Wolf minced no words about what is known within the highest National Security circles. "There are several large UFOs in our solar system."

I spoke with Dr. Wolf next about an experiencer I know, who has had frequent communication from a humanoid extraterrestrial identifying himself as originating from the Altair system. (Altair is a very bright, variable double star in the constellation Aquila, 15.7 light- years from Earth.) This woman experiencer had met this extraterrestrial in the 1950s, in the course of her training for highly-classified intelligence assignments. Wolf was nonchalant about such human-extraterrestrial interactions, having himself worked side by side in classified government laboratories with a human-appearing ET from the Altair system and a "Grey" humanoid scientist from the Zeta Reticuli system.

"Altair's fourth and fifth planets are inhabited. In fact, the people from Altair colonized the Pleiades system long ago. The human-looking Pleiadean extraterrestrials some people meet are actually ancestrally Altairians. There are two variants, the Semitic-looking ones and the Nordic-looking ones. The 'Semitics' are the race which landed at Holloman Air Force Base (New Mexico) in the '60s, and conversed with some generals there."

Dr. Wolf also revealed that, as a military-intelligence Colonel-physician, he has worked with some very-high military officials who have had close extraterrestrial encounters, and needed some counseling to adjust to their paradigm-shattering experience.

We also talked about extraterrestrial-human hybrids, who have been genetically engineered by certain extraterrestrial cultures. More recently, secret U.S. national security projects have attempted to also bioengineer such hybrids, having some success. Wolf characterized such hybrids as having three-helix-strand DNA and fore-lobe brains. "Europa [Jupiter's seventh moon] is a place for such hybrids [to live]."

The conversation turned to information I received from an National Security Agency source about NSA's ability to monitor an individual's brainwave and thought activity from special surveillance satellites. Dr. Wolf did not deny such technology, and added, "The government can create confabulated [contrived] memory in a person through Amytal [sodium amobarbital, a hypnotic drug] and microwave [brain] scrambling."

Wolf brought up the current week-long series of specials on the Learning Channel about UFOs and extraterrestrial-human encounters. He touted that as part of the government's conditioning program, which he calls the Processed Release of Information. We got into our on-going argument about the pace and timing of public acknowledgment by officials of ET contact, with my arguing that such time has come. Wolf demurred, saying that the national security Old Guard, with which he identifies himself, feel the public is not yet ready, and needs more such conditioning. This writer vigorously disagreed, pointing out that the government has consistently misread the public as fools,

whereas the public is generally well ahead of government estimates.

Dr. Wolf noted that the national security community is divided. The Old Guard of scientists, military and intelligence officers with access to UFO secrets is nearing retirement and want the reality of ET contact to come out, but slowly. The Cabal, a rogue group of young generals, intelligence officers and defense contractors, opposes disclosure, and wants to enjoy for themselves the power, prestige and profit that comes from continuing the monopoly on ET information and technology.

Wolf said, "They are the ones who shot a [Star Wars] weapon at a UFO near [Space Shuttle] STS-48."

Dr. Wolf concluded the conversation cordially, despite our differences on policy. He anticipates being authorized to make further disclosures in the near future.

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Carmen Poll - Evaluation

The results of the Carmen poll were much the way I expected them. The sightings were more numerous than in Sanford, and they were of a much better type. This is shown in the high percentages in the responses to questions 4 and 5. In fact almost 50% of the sightings were close enough to the object that it became an actual object as opposed to a light in the sky which usually accounts for the majority of UFO sightings.

The most stunning result however was in the comparison of the responses from questions 3 and 9. According to those polled, more students claimed to have seen UFOs than Boeing 747 Jumbo Jets. This is the first time such a result has shown up, and its implications and interpretations are many.

Of those polled it was found that 85% of the students had either seen a UFO themselves or knew personally someone who did.

The results are so strong in Carmen that they dwarf other Manitoba rural areas. Comparison to National Gallup polls, show that personal experiences in Carmen are six times the National average. Nationally only 11% claim to have seen a UFO, and only 54% believe in the possible existence of UFO.

Other polls should be done in the area, because these primary results seem to back up the statements that Carmen could be the UFO capital of the World.

Graphs & Diagrams

This section is again a section which is more for the scientific mind. It will include graphs to show where the heaviest sighting took place, an ^{idea} of how many there were, ~~where~~ ^{give an}.

I ~~visited~~ lectured in ~~many~~ many of the country high schools and junior highs. At each school I made an attempt to poll the students as to how many had had sighting and what type of sightings these were. The schools included, Roland Elementary, Carmen Collegiate, Starbuck Junior High School, Sanford Collegiate, Girdle Collegiate, Manitow Collegiate, and an elementary school in Winnipeg for comparison. On graph form I will illustrate how the sightings were (a) basically country (b) restricted to definite parts of the province. (c) the high number as compared to national average.

There will be two maps of southern Manitoba. The first will show the locations of the ground lights, and the second will show two things (a) a double line phenomena (general rule in v-fology states that a flap will follow a ~~general~~ straight line through the area) (b) the location of towers, hydro-lines and landings.

There will be a list made to show (a) the flap periods (b) of heavy UFO activity (c) where they occurred.

The final item will be a map of the three flight paths of Charlie Red Star. This aspect gave Charlie his fame because he would come by Carmen from only three directions and fly in the same path each time. People were extremely interested because they were able to get close to the object, after knowing where he went. The Planetarium was also interested in these flight paths because again they exhibited a "repeatable phenomena."

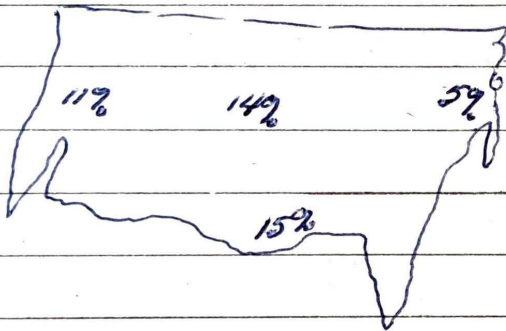

Manitoba centre wants to know

UFO spotters — you're wanted.

Wanted by the Manitoba Centre for UFO Studies, the first co-ordinated effort in a decade in the province to investigate sightings of unidentified flying objects.

The centre is the outgrowth of two former UFO groups — Ufology Research of Manitoba and the Canadian Aerial Phenomenon Research Organization — and is now associated with the Manitoba Planetarium.

Its aim is to provide a central data collecting and investigation body to which UFO spotters can turn

"Now we're all working together in a central area ... on a little more scientific basis. We'll now be able to solicit help from professionals in various fields," explained Edward Barker, a member of the planetarium

staff and consultant to the centre.

"The ultimate objective of the whole thing is to find out what and why they (UFOs) are," Barker said Friday.

Little green men from outer space? Not necessarily, Barker said. Unrecognized natural phenomena? Perhaps.

Whatever THEY are, they're recognized as legitimate phenomena by a growing portion of the scientific community. And that credibility has encouraged people to report suspected sightings, Barker said.

Over the past 10 years, about 5,000 sightings have been reported in Manitoba. Dr. J. A. Hynek of the Centre for UFO Studies in Chicago has about 80,000 Canadian cases of investigated sightings on his centre's computer.

Investigators estimate between 70 and 80 per cent of sightings turn out to be misidentifications of ordinary objects such as satellites, airplane lights, balloons and even birds under special conditions.

Another five per cent of reports may be hoaxes while about 15 per cent involve unidentified elements not readily explained away. In addition, it's believed many more sightings go unreported, Barker said.

Many Manitoba sightings occur in the central and southern areas, perhaps because of the population concentration there. About 70 to 80 per cent of sightings occur in the rural areas.

"The most commonly reported sightings are nocturnal lights doing some peculiar manoeuvring," said Barker, who has investigated UFOs for 10 years.

"In Manitoba, the vast majority of sightings are associated on, near or around microwave towers. Also, lakes attract them."

Earlier this year, sightings were reported in Sundown, southeast of Winnipeg, and Fraserwood, north of the city.

Two years ago, several sightings were reported in the Carman area. The objects were nicknamed Charlie Red Star. Investigators found significantly different radiation in the vicinity where the objects were spotted, although the case hasn't progressed much since then.

One of the more interesting and important cases, now 10 years old, is still under investigation. It's the Steve Michalak case, involving the Winnipeg hobby geologist who reported he was burned by a UFO while at Falcon Lake in May, 1967.

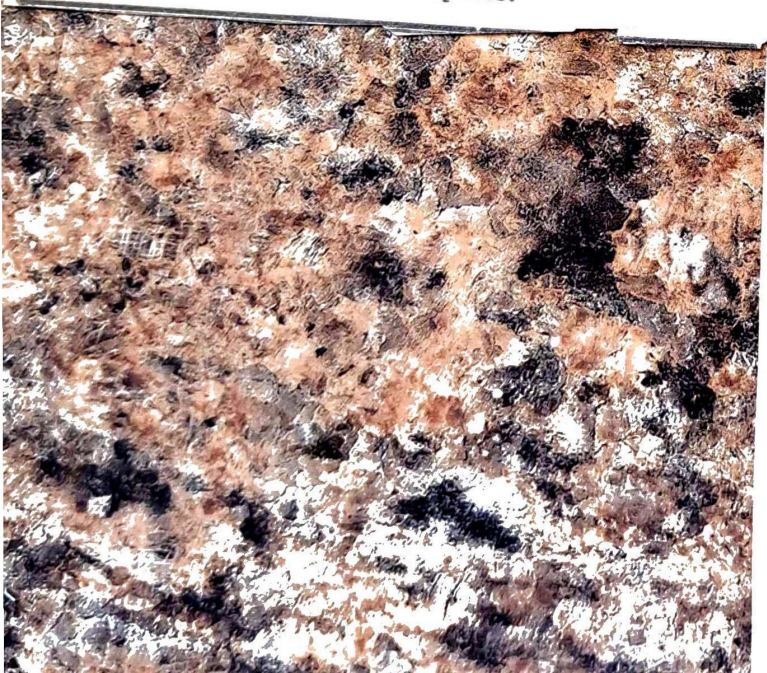
Investigators are still working on that one but aren't able yet to discuss their findings publicly. The centre won't discuss its cases publicly without the observer's consent, Barker said.

The centre wants to encourage UFO spotters to report their findings to the planetarium, 190 Rupert Avenue, "the sooner, the better," especially if the object appears to have landed, he said.

Barker, Ernst Speelman, a planetarium technician, and four others outside of the planetarium organization form the current core of investigators who will be able to utilize planetarium equipment, office space and staff for their projects. However, they won't be receiving any financial support from the planetarium.

Members of the centre will be involved in internal organization during the summer, trying to contact university personnel to see if they will help support the centre's work and co-ordinating activities with police forces, which often receive the first reports of sightings.

The centre is also establishing contacts with

The results of this poll must be viewed separately from the results that were obtained in other schools throughout south-western manitoba. This is due to the fact that the people that attended this lecture did so because they had an intrest in what was being discussed, whereas in other former polls the students polled had no choice in whether or not they would attend the lecture.

The results do however show that the Gimli area is a very active area. The lecture that was given in Manitou Manitoba was given under the same controls, but the results of the poll were much closer to the national average than the results that were obtained in Gimli.

The number of people who believed in the existance of urOs was therefore almost 93% whereas it was about 73% in area were the student had to attend the lecture, and the national average is only around 54%.

The number of people who had actually seen a UFO was over half those in attendance, and therefore it can account for their intrest in the topic. Not only had they seen a UFO, but it can be seen from the results of questions four and five that a lot of these sightings were "major" in nature, and were cases that deem investigation. Of the 42 people who responded to the questionnaire, 11 have or will be investigated.

The one section that came as a surprize to this investigator was the possible number of people outside the school, and in the Gimli area that have been involved. This result can be seen in the results of question #8. This however could be accounted for in a large part by the big UFO sighting that was made by Peter Zazulinski, as it did recieve publicity in the local paper.

In conclusion, it can be conclude that this audience was one that was well read, and had had enough experience of their own to be well acquainted with the subject matter.

Evaluation of the Poll at Sanford Collegiate - Nov.23/1976

The results of the poll were much as had been expected, except for a few points. I had expected the number of people who had seen a UFO to be at least 50% whereas it was only 43.3%. The number of people who claimed to have seen a UFO in their life is still four times the US national average. One question asked dealt with time lapses. The number that stated they experienced this amounted to 2.9% of those polled. This figure is much, much higher than I expected, and I will have to check to ensure that all students involved understood the question.

The rest of the responses went as expected. The percentage that believed in UFOs was extremely high at 72.9%, with the number who didn't believe in them very low at 10.5%. These figures are great extremes when compared to national polls, but this was expected, and is therefore some confirmation to claims about the extreme heavy ^{UFO} flap during the period of 1975-1976. The poll also confirmed somewhat the fact that the majority of the sighting took place in the last two years. The poll is not a perfect indicator in this sense because of the age of the students. They have not been around for a considerable period of time, and have therefore had the majority of their unique experiences in the last few years of their life.

Some points of interest were: 17% of those who did not believe in UFOs stated that they had seen something in the last two years that could be classified as a UFO. 76.1% of those polled stated that either they had sighted a UFO or that they knew someone in the Sanford area who had.

Of the 277 replies to the poll, 29 were good enough at first glance to be investigated.

The above is only written to pick out highlights within the poll. The poll itself provides a great deal of other information.
