

INVESTIGATION INTO UNIDENTIFIED
FLYING OBJECTS

Question No. 487—Mr. Schreyer:

1. Were any formal investigation conducted by the Department of National Defence or any other agency of government relative to the reported

sightings of unidentified flying objects in eastern Manitoba, which reports originated during the months of May and June, 1967?

2. If so, were any such investigations conducted with the joint co-operation of the United States Air Force or any other U.S. government agency or academic institution?

3. Is the Department of National Defence or any other agency of the federal government now in possession of a report on any such investigations?

4. If so, will the report be made public?

5. Has a government committee been established to review this subject-matter?

Hon. Léo Cadieux (Minister of National Defence): 1. Yes, the Department of National Defence, together with the Department of National Health and Welfare, and the Royal Canadian Mounted Police conducted an investigation into the alleged sighting of an unidentified flying object by Mr. Stephen Michalak at Falcon Lake, Manitoba.

2. No. However, representatives from the Universities of Colorado and Arizona conducted an informal independent investigation.

3. Yes.

4. It is not the intent of the Department of National Defence to make public the report of the alleged sighting.
