I am writing in connection with your article MOON IS A UFO BASE which appeared in the September 29 issue of National Bulletin.

As a serious UFO researcher and author, I am very interested in this particular story by Sam Pepper. I am interested in this in a purely personal way, as I am a private researcher. I have two questions about this story, however, and I do hope you will be kind enough to answer them.

I am most interested in this matter, as I, too, am seeking the truth about the UFO enigma, and I hope you will clarify this for me.
