Dear Mr. Bray,

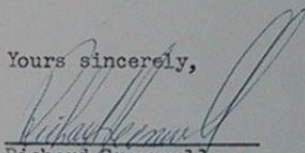
Thank you for your letter of February 13, 1971, which was passed to me for attention.

During the re-organization APRO underwent about 2 years ago, it was decided that we would maintain Representatives in all foreign countries except Canada. This was because Canada is a very large country and a Representative would not be able to operate effectively residing in one area. True, we have Representatives in other large countries, such as Australia and Brazil, but Canada is located right next to the U.S. and its culture is not to different from that of the U.S. All these considerations, as well as the fact that our Field Investigators Network operates in Canada, led to the decision.

Concerning your other letter of November 30, already answered by Mrs. Lorenzen, we have, in fact, already looked into this case. One of our Consultants in Metallurgy, Dr. Robert W. Johnson, conducted an analysis on one of the samples and we have also been in contact with Dr. Millman on the case, who has been most cooperative. We are still awaiting the report you mention from Dr. Millman and would prefer to await this before taking further steps.
