Dear Senator Jackson:

Mr. John W. Warner, Jr., Assistant to the Director of the United States Secret Service, has referred to me for reply the inquiry you received from Mr. and Mrs. John Williamson concerning the investigation of a military helicopter crash on May 26, 1973.

First, please be assured that there is absolutely no effort to cover up the results of the investigation of this accident, which caused the death of a Secret Service agent and the loss of one of the President's helicopters. Secondly, at no time did the President fear that a sabotage attempt was aimed at him in this incident.

The reason there has been no announcement of the cause of the accident is simply that two very extensive investigations of the matter are presently being conducted. These independent boards are due to submit the results of their investigations in the very near future. Following these submissions, more detailed information will be available and I would be happy to advise you further regarding the circumstances of the accident.
