

Q: Do they appear adaptable to earth conditions - can they breathe our air?

A: In some occupant reports they are wearing what appears to be the equivalent of a space suit but there are hundreds of cases where they do not appear to be utilizing any breathing equipment.

Q: Have there ever been any incidents involving "hardware" - i.e. material evidence remaining after a landing?

A: Yes, they are few in number but they do indicate that UFOs are material objects.

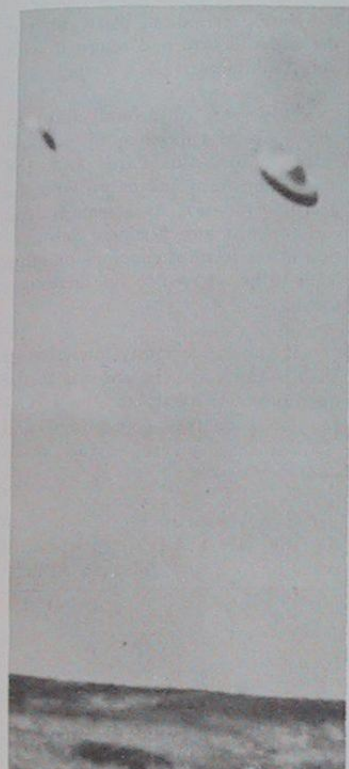
All About APRO

Now that the reader has the answer to the questions most asked about UFOs he or she may be asking: Why APRO?

The answer is quite simple: The UFO problem has not been solved and APRO, being the oldest, largest and most experienced UFO Research Organization in the world, is most likely to find the solutions to many pressing questions.

Founded in 1952, APRO was 22 years old in January, 1974, and is now in its 23rd year of existence. During those years, APRO published in the *A.P.R.O. Bulletin*, every 2 months, the results of its research, the latest reports from around the world, book reviews and pertinent scientific comments.

In 1957 APRO began building its International Staff as well as its Scientific Consulting Staff. At present, APRO has 41 scientists on its Consulting Panels, including Biological Sciences, Medical Science, Physical Sciences and Social Sciences, and Representatives in 47 countries around the world.

Q: Have UFOs landed and have they been photographed on the ground?

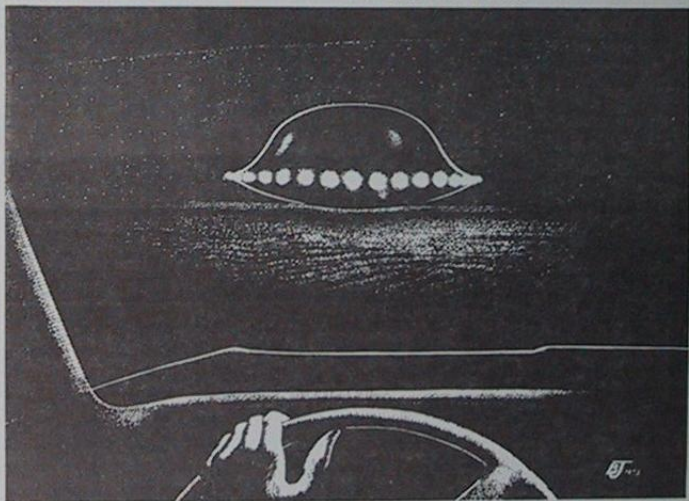
A: Yes, there have been hundreds of reports of UFOs on the ground. They sometimes leave burned areas and/or depressions in the earth. However, there are no authenticated photos of a landed UFO.

Q: Have there been any reports of occupants?

A: Yes. We have on file over a thousand reported cases involving occupants.

Q: What do the occupants look like?

A: They appear to be humanoid in shape but in most cases are much smaller than humans - between 3 and 5 feet in height. An artist's rendering of the famous Gill occupant case can be seen on the front page.
