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Dear Grant:

First of all, I want to thank you very much for the material that you sent to me. I especially appreciated that Wilson memmo dated Sept 15, 1969, that suggested that Smiths "Geo-magnetics" memmo should at no time be made available to the public. I heard about that memmo but never had a copy (Wilson's Memmo). I also really appreciated that copy of Stan Friedman's "Access to Information Request Form", which shows that he was interested enough in Dr. Eric A. Walker's back-ground.

Back in December 1983 Stan Friedman called Dr. Robert I. Sarbacher via Telephone. During that conversation, Sarbacher stated "I did not attend the meetings at Wright Field concerning the recovered Saucers; but there was one person who attended

all of the meetings. I can't remember his name, he wrote a book on electrical engineering, was a member of the R.D.B., and was head of the electrical engineering department at a university in Pennsylvania."

Grant, I did some research and found that this mans name was Dr. Eric A. Walker. I called Dr. Sarbacher, who verified that Walker was the man who did attend all those meetings at Wright Patterson A.F.B.

I wrote to Stan Friedman on March 21, 1984, telling him that Dr. Eric A. Walker was our man. Friedman wrote back to me on May 25, 1984 (exactly 7 days prior to his "Access To Information Request" of June 2, 84) telling me that he was sure the Walker was the right man and that he had contacted Walker. Friedman stated that Walker knows something but is not talking.

I tried to correspond with Dr. Walker on March 12, 1984 (He had an unlisted telephone number - which Friedman obtained from Penn State University as Scientist to Scientist - he would not give it to me). The answer to my correspondence was
