THE LUMBERTON REPORT--UFO ACTIVITY IN SOUTHERN NORTH CAROLINA, APRIL 3-9, 1975, Jennie Zeidman (1976, 59 pages)

In this six-day period when at least 57 separate UFO events were reported over an area of approximately 5000 square miles by 48 police officers and an unknown number of private citizens, remarkably consistent descriptions were given of two apparently distinct phenomena. This report describes the immediate investigation conducted by two Center investigators, and the follow-up by the author on the spot. Maps, charts, sketches and photographs of the physical traces of one incident are included.

THE UFOCAT CODEBOOK, by David Saunders (Second Edition) 1978.

A guide to the interpretation of print-out lists of UFO sightings and other related material in UFOCAT, the computer catalog of over 100,000 entries of about 80,000 UFO sightings and related events. The Codebook describes the method of coding on a 120-column format, types of sightings and subtypes, dates, times, locations, number of witnesses and name of primary witness (unless confidential), plus other pertinent geographic and social data.

Packet of Ten Coding Sheets

These provide the 80 most important columns of the 120-column format. They are useful only for coding material to add to UFOCAT.

PHYSICAL TRACES OF UFO SIGHTINGS: A Computer Print-out. Second Edition, 1980; 5633 entries, 159 pages*)

An index in code of all known UFO sightings for which physical traces were reported, listed from the 288 sources of publications and research files which describe the events verbally. Access to a UFOCAT Codebook (see above) is essential for interpreting the material, and access to the sources would be necessary for further investigation.

Date, time, location, number and names of witnesses (unless confidential), and type of trace and of UFO are listed in the print-out, however, along with some other details.
