Dear Bray,

My editor, Mr. O'Brien, has passed your letter (9/24/69) to me for a reply.

First of all, I have certain connections in NASA dating back to the early 1960's when I was employed in Washington as ^aresearcher for the United States Information Agency. Several of my colleagues at USIA moved over to NASA along with well over two hundred people from that agency. I have kept up intimate contact with two of these men. It is from this pool of connections that the facts of the story were gleaned.

I'm sorry I can't be more precise but if certain people in NASA were to find the identity of my informants there would be hell to pay.

As the government hasn't brought any suit or charges against BULLETIN the legal implications don't yet exist. In any case, from my experience in the civil service I would rather think that ^{the} Nixon administration doesn't want too much publicity about such things. Awkward situations are
