About two years ago, we had a big re-union of most of the original members of the old Ottawa Flying Saucer Club founded by WBS and which later became the Ottawa New Sciences Club. If ever you are in Calgary, you should try to get in touch with 'Buck' Buchanan who worked with WBS in the old days and is a mine of information about the research and experiments carried out by WBS. Dear Grant:

Many thanks for your letter of Nov. 24/78 from which I was very pleased to know that you have found the Smith Tape so interesting and useful in your research and that you will be including parts of it in a lecture at the U of Manitoba dealing with Government involvement in UFOs. Of course, all the Gov'ts of the world carried out research into the UFO mystery and in the very early years, their findings were open and WBS was Canada's "Flying Saucer Man" and he kept a filing cabinet of UFO sightings in Canada he investigated, in his office and after his death, the Can. Gov't confiscated them. This was prior to the Washington-imposed "Silence Policy" falling over the UFO scene after which the U.S. & Can. Gov'ts released little or nothing on the subject and even now, while the U.S. Gov't. has released some of the sightings from its Project Blue Book, I doubt that it has included the more important sightings.

As regards contacts made with AFPA & TYLA, WBS received messages indirectly from them and as regards the Canadian engineer in contact with TYLA, I am reasonably sure that it wasn't Art Bridge. More likely it was Ken Killick who, between ourselves, is a psychic, but for professional reasons, he likes to keep this under cover. Ken was one of the original members of the old Ottawa Flying Saucer Club, headed by WBS and he worked a lot with him on scientific projects, gaining information, presumably from TYLA, on advanced concepts of science from which they built proto-types, some of which were successful. I am willing to give you Ken's address, but I must ask you to promise me not to reveal my name or anything I have told you about him as this might affect our friendship. I suggest that you write to him simply saying that you heard on Smith's Tape that a Canadian engineer had been in contact with Tyla, and that someone had suggested that it might be him. I have reasons to believe that Ken is a genuine psychic, but I can't promise you that he will admit it, as he is somewhat secretive about this side of his life, as I've said, for professional reasons, but it might be worth a try. 836-2378 I do wish you the best of luck with this and also with your request through legal council in New York to obtain documents concerning UFO studies in Canada by WBS and UFO cases he investigated in the States - all to be done under the U.S. Freedom of Information Act. I can tell you this much - in the early years before the so-called Silence Policy, WBS was a frequent visitor to Washington where he exchanged UFO reports & views with U.S. colleagues. You ask if I have a question which has never been answered over the years and there is one, but again, I must ask you to keep my name out of it. A long time ago, there was a big UFO flap over Washington DC which was mentioned in some of the early UFO publications, but I can't recall the exact date altho' some of the older ufologists might remember it. Anyway, a fleet of UFOs flew over Washington and they were observed by a large number of people. One of these alien aircraft was shot down by U.S. artillery & the wreckage of it was whisked away to a secret hangar where a number of such crashed UFOs were stored & heavily guarded. Some time later, WBS was asked by a top U.S. Naval Officer in the Pentagon to carry out an analysis on a sample of the metal taken from the crashed UFO shot down in Washington and WBS was bound to secrecy about his findings. According to Mrs. Smith, his analysis & report were sent to the CIA. There have been many enquiries about this over the years, but to my knowledge, nothing has been revealed or even acknowledged about this incident. I know that Smith's part in it is true, but the rest may be another big U.S. cover-up! There can hardly be any comparison between U.S. and Canadian UFO research in the early days because the U.S. had many men working on it whereas in Canada, WBS's research was a one-man effort! I too, have not heard anything from the Smith family for a long time & would prefer that you contact Mrs. Smith & advise her of your intention. She is more likely to talk to you than to me. As far as I know, her address is: Canterbury Apartments, Suite 507, Canterbury Street, Ottawa, Ont. Once again, I wish you Good Luck with all your endeavours and do keep me posted from time to time.
