Dear Dolman:

To bring you up to date on the results of my government brief, you have copies of governmental replies up to July 26, 1983. Enclosed, therefore, are copies of everything since then, which include my letter to the Interdepartmental Committee on Space, the reply from the Chairman, and the reply from the National Research Council of Canada.

The reply from the Interdepartmental Committee on Space, says nothing but they referred my brief to the NRC. I anticipated the reply which I received. It also says nothing! However, page one of the NRC letter from Dr. McNamara (whom I know quite well) is amusing in its attempt to ignore the accumulated evidence. I wonder what is the definition of a "threat", when unidentified objects intrude into the airspace over nuclear weapons storage areas, yet present "no threat". McNamara's 3rd paragraph misses my point entirely as not I nor any other capable ufologist has claimed that we accept everything a witness says. We don't say the sighting was a UFO simply on the word of the witnesses. We investigate to find out what the witness really did see. But we do accept the word of reliable witnesses that they saw something which they could not identify, then we, the investigators look into it, and manage to identify 90% of reports as something other than a UFO. These people just do not understand what we are telling them.
