Dear Mr. Bray:

My apologies for this slow response. I have been waiting to formalize plans for the U.F.O. discussion to be held at Seneca College. This has now been done and the event will take place on November 20 at 7:30 pm., in the Minkler Auditorium of Seneca located at Finch and Woodbine, in Toronto.

Guest panelists will be Dr. Allen Hynek of Northwestern University and Dr. Roy Pritchard, a psychologist, from McMaster University. We have calculated our expenses for advertising and auditorium fees and it appears we will have to charge \$2.00 per ticket. If you wish to reserve a ticket for the evening write me and I will see you get one.

For the benefit of those who were unable to attend the meeting we had in May of this year a summary of the proposals made follows.

1. All interested A.P.R.O. members should receive a list of cooperating field investigators in Ontario.
2. We should have at least one meeting of field investigators, each year to assist one another with problems we may be having in U.F.O. investigations.
3. Since A.P.R.O. cannot publish all U.F.O. reports sent them, those concerning Ontario should be forwarded to me or Norm Foster. We will summarize your reports and send a copy to interested members. In this way we can all be better informed about local sightings of U.F.O.'s if we are questioned by the news media.
4. Members at the meeting also felt that accuracy in reporting was more important than promptness in forwarding reports to A.P.R.O. since they are unable to suggest answers to our sightings when information is lacking. We should try to come up with possible answers ourselves.
5. All present agreed that it was important to interview people reporting a sighting quickly as memory fades with time and data vital to a sighting can be forgotten.

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
