Dear Mr. Jamieson:

I am writing further to my letter to Right Honourable Pierre Trudeau of March 14, 1971, and the reply from the Under-Secretary of State for External Affairs of April 13, 1971 on the matter of placing a Resolution on Unidentified Flying Objects (UFOs) before the U.N. General Assembly.

I have now been informed by the Ambassador-at-large, Permanent Mission of Grenada to the United Nations, that Prime Minister Rt. Honourable Sir Eric Gairy has succeeded in having this subject placed on the agenda of the General Assembly. A Resolution is scheduled for debate in the Special Political Committee during the week beginning November 21, 1977. Sir Eric included some important comments on the matter of UFOs in his address to the General Assembly on October 7, 1977.

I do hope that Canada, having failed to accomplish this not-so-difficult-after-all matter of placing a Resolution before the U.N. will now give its full support to Sir Eric Gairy's Resolution.
