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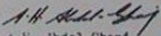
Dear Mr. VonKeviczky,

Thank you for your letter of November 1967 and the enclosure.

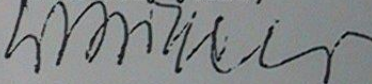
With reference to our previous numerous correspondence on the subject of UFO, I must inform you once more of the strictly limited role of the Outer Space Affairs Group of the United Nations in this regard. The subject of unidentified flying objects has never been an item on the agenda of the United Nations Committee on the Peaceful Uses of Outer Space. It is only if a Member State of the United Nations decides that this is a subject which should be brought up for the attention of the Committee that it can be officially taken up. For these reasons, there is no basis under which I can give support to any international effort to solve the UFO problem.

Meanwhile, I have noted your organization's concern about the UFO phenomena.
