I am sure you will be interested to learn that what is probably the single most important event in the history of Unidentified Flying Object research to date is the incorporation of the Center for UFO Studies, in Northfield, Illinois.

This new center is under the direction of Dr. J. Allen Hynek, Chairman, Department of Astronomy, Northwestern University, Chicago, Director of the Lindheimer Astronomical Research Center, and was for twenty years the UFO scientific consultant to the U.S. Air Force.

Since the famous "Condon Report" from the University of Colorado was exposed as a farce, Dr. Hynek has been working tirelessly to establish a new scientific study to determine the nature and origin of UFOs. He has now been successful in getting this new endeavour organized and financed by non-government sources.

I believe the attached correspondence from Dr. Hynek is self-explanatory and I will be grateful if the Canadian public can be informed of this important development through the medium of the press. Also enclosed is a copy of a letter which appeared in "Physics Today", June 1971, which provides additional background.

It is important to note that UFO sighting and investigation reports from Canada will be welcomed by Dr. Hynek and his staff. There is no place in Canada which welcomes such reports, including the National Research Council which should, but does not investigate them yet always manages to "explain" them.
