Dear Sir/Madam

I enclose an International Money Order for \$20 in payment for a copy of THE UFO CONNECTION by Arthur Bray. I trust that this will be sufficient to cover the cost of postage (ideally via Air Mail). I procured a copy of Mr Bray's last book in 1974, and was much impressed with its sensible and objective approach.

I am also writing to enquire if you - or the publishing company you use - would be interested in reading a manuscript on the controversial contactee George Adamski. Although ufologists and the public alike have condemned Adamski's claims and denounced him as a charlatan, my co-author and I have strong grounds for believing that much of what he related may be substantially true. We base this belief on many years of research into his claims, and the M/S includes a great deal of unpublished material, which we have tried to present in an objective manner. New evidence for and against is introduced - much of it sensational.

The book is in two parts; the first written by Miss Lou Zinsstag of Basle, Switzerland, who knew Adamski personally and was his Swiss co-worker from 1957-63. She reminisces about the man, and includes a chapter on her visit with him to the Vatican in May 1963 when he was received privately by Pope John XXIII and awarded a gold medallion of the Ecumenical Council, just three days prior to the Pope's death. Although the visit has been officially denied by the Vatican, Adamski could not possibly have obtained the medallion any other way, since it was not available to the public at the time. Moreover, both Lou Zinsstag and another friend made a special trip to Rome with Adamski for just this specific visit to the Vatican, and witnessed him entering a private door in the building, from which he returned one hour later.

Miss Zinsstag includes a chapter on her conversations with Carl Gustav Jung (to whom she was related), wherein the great psychologist's opinions on Adamski are discussed. Miss Zinsstag has published a number of articles on her celebrated cousin, the latest of which appears in 'The Journal of The American Society of Psychosomatic Dentistry & Medicine' (Vol 27 No 2, 1980: 2802 Mermaid Avenue, Brooklyn, N.Y. 11224), which will give you an idea of her style - should you be sufficiently interested, of course.

Lou Zinsstag also had a few experiences which confirmed Adamski's allegations that some extraterrestrials are - or were - living among us, and on one occasion in Basle witnessed a contact of Adamski's. She later describes how,
