CASH AWARDS

The Committee, under the authorization of its charter, may make cash awards to individuals for meritorious effort or achievement (in any of several fields) contributing to the advancement of space flight. Cash awards may be given for especially clear or definitive photographs of unidentified flying objects or other aerial phenomena, for rare meteoritic or fireball residue, or other material of extraterrestrial origin and, in general, for any significant contribution to the investigative work of the Committee.

LEGAL STAFF

Procedural and legal details of continuing operations of the Committee are to be directed by a corporation attorney who will serve not only on the Policy and Steering Subcommittee but also as Secretary of the Committee.

The Secretary shall have cognizance of all matters of committee policy and activity where the general public is concerned and where questions of liability may arise. He shall be the responsible officer for the signing of all contracts, agreements, and other legal documents. He shall be registered as the resident agent of the corporation in the District of Columbia.

The Assistant Secretary may be a person in the professional employ and in the office of the attorney for the corporation, whose official duties and responsibilities will include the preparation and maintenance of the Corporation's Minute Book.

PATENT AND COPYRIGHT SERVICES

The corporation shall retain an outside firm of patent counsel for the preparation, filing and prosecution of U.S. and foreign patent or copyright claims. This firm is responsible to the Secretary of the Committee.
